PSALM 84

In Psalm 84 we are taught by the Sons of Korah (a group from the tribe a Levi who served God's people as they worshiped in the temple). They were separated from the presence of God in the temple, and it was during their exile that they express a longing to know and experience the knowledge and blessing of the Lord. It was their separation from home that exposed a vital connection between orientation of the heart and experiencing the knowledge and blessing of God.
