1	<b>Jes</b> 15:15	us makes it clear that sin was not the cause of the John 9 man's blindness. Is sin ever the cause of illness? (John 5:14, 1 Cor. 11:30, James 5)
		a. Can you think of something in your life that you wonder if it happened because of your sin or your parents' sin? About what in your life do you ask, "Why me?"
