1907 - Great Korean Revival led to Christian involvement in regaining independence

30% of South Korea is Christian

Six of eleven presidents have been Christian

### India

Not Eastern Orthodox; not Roman Catholic

The St. Thomas Evangelical church is established in 1961.

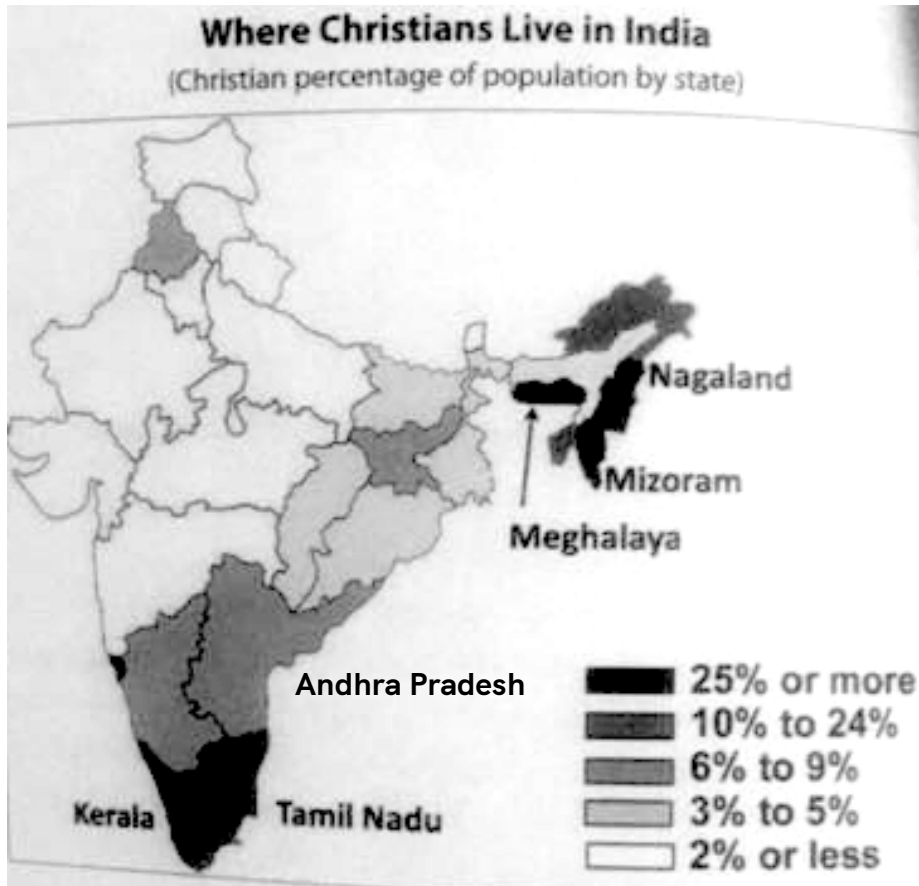
Modern Hinduism formed in the 1800s: unity and nationalism.

## China

Robert Morrison 马礼逊 (Mǎ lǐ xùn)

First Opium War, as a result:

- 1) Christianity is legalized
- 2) Five coastal cities open up for trade and permanent residence by foreigners

Popular history: Christianity and opium trade are inseparable.
