But, many times, we are tempted to live like He has not come. We are tempted to live in a system that ignores what He did when He came. Before Christ came, the tabernacle system of laws and sacrifices was setup as the way sinful man could approach a Holy God, and it was all meant to be a shadow pointing to the day Jesus would come and flesh it all out. As we celebrate this time of year, Jesus did come, and with that coming radically changed every aspect of how His people are to approach Him. He came and died on the cross as the once for all sacrifice for sin. No more sacrifices needed. His offering is enough to fix our standing with God. So, how do we respond to that? Our passage this morning will give us the answer. I wonder, do you respond rightly to God coming as a man? Or, do you live like His coming and sacrifice on the cross was not enough by adding the old way of offering God our good works to what God has already done? Jesus is here...and His offering is once for all.

# SERMON DISCUSSION STARTERS

- Do you live in the shadow of God coming as a man? What areas of your life drift back into a tabernacle system of relationship with God? List 5-6 thoughts you have had over the last week that reveal that you try to make sacrifices in order to gain a better standing with God. Confess them in prayer and meditate on the times that Heb. 10:1-14 says Jesus' offering was enough.
- According to our passage in Hebrews 10, what does it look like for you to live by the gospel? If your position before God has been settled by the once for all offering of Jesus, what should be your practice? How does Hebrews 10 say that we live? Read and think about Jeremiah 31:33-34 remembering that our practice is based on God working out the promises He has made and written on our hearts... Write out your application in sentences like:

- Why is it important to distinguish between our settled position in Christ and our daily practice with regard to God's forgiveness?
- \*\* How do you respond to Jesus as a baby? What thoughts do you have when you think see a nativity scene? With a friend or someone in your community group, talk through 3 or 4 different ways that you can specifically worship the Baby in Whom "the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily" (Col. 2:9)
- Meditate on and discuss the incarnation with someone. Think through what it meant for God to take on a body. Besides the cross, what other trials did Jesus accept in the body prepared for Him? The chart below may help.

# **TODAY'S NOTES & TEXT**

For since the law has but a shadow of the good things to come instead of the true form of these realities, it can never, by the same sacrifices that are continually offered every year, make perfect those who draw near. Otherwise, would they not have ceased to be offered, since the worshipers, having once been cleansed, would no longer have any consciousness of sins? But in these sacrifices there is a reminder of sins every year. For it is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins. Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body have you prepared for me;in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure. Then I said, 'Behold, I have come to do your will, O God, as it is written of me in the scroll of the book." When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), then he added, "Behold, I have come to do your will." He does away with the first in order to establish the second. And by that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all. And every priest stands daily at his service, offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God, waiting from that time until his enemies should be made a footstool for his feet. For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are being sanctified. And the Holy Spirit also bears witness to us; for after saying, "This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, declares the Lord: I will put my laws on their hearts, and write them on their minds," then he adds, "I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more."Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin. (Hebrews 10:1-18)
