## FOR FURTHER THOUGHT...

Without any other study, write an outline of the gospel. Compare it to the God Man Christ Response outline that you see on the other side of the sheet. Did you include everything that God uses to call men to Himself? Which part is easiest to leave out?

Because God calls all men to be saved with the general call, does that mean man's response is optional? Why or why not?

Beyond conviction (John 16:8-11), effectual calling includes several elements: illumination (1 Cor. 2:12-16;2 Cor. 4:3-6); drawing (John 6:44; Rom. 8:30); and the gifts of repentance (2 Tim. 2:25; Acts 11:18) and faith (Eph. 2:8-9; Phil. 1:29). Pick one of these topics and meditate on the work of God in man's heart to bring Him to Himself. What emotions and thoughts of God overflow in your heart as a result?

God's purposes in election and effectual calling are difficult to wrestle with. Read the following verses and write 4 truth statements about God and man. (Matt. 22:14, Matt. 24:24-31, Luke 18:7, John 5:21, John 6:37–39, John 13:18, John 15:16, 19) Should we discuss and think about election and effectual calling? Why or why not?

Why does God elect and effectually call sinners to salvation? Read 1 Thess. 1:4; 2 Thess. 2:13; Ps. 65:4; Deut 8:6-8; John 15:16; and Rom. 8:29 for help.

The elect receive the effectual call of God to be saved. Do you know who those people are? Does that affect whether or not we should share the gospel? Answer scripturally using Rom. 10:13-17, Matt. 28:18-20; Luke 24:47; Acts 1:8.
