TITUS 1:1-4

- 1 **When have you sensed a need to step up and correct something you knew to be false?** Perhaps it was someone who believed an urban legend, conspiracy theory, or even a satirical news headline. What were some of the emotions you felt in that situation?

⚙️ *Now think about your own life. Have you ever realized you were believing a lie about a Biblical truth?*

📖 *How have you seen the truth of the Word reshape your thinking in an area?*

- 2 **Is there such a thing as the ministry of confrontation?** If so, what does it look like? (see Jude 23, Gal. 2:11-14, 1 Tim. 1:19-20, Acts 18:26, 2 John 10-11, Titus 3:10)

🗨️ *How could a ministry of confrontation be misused or abused?*

⚙️ *What makes us uncomfortable in confronting false teaching?*

🗨️ *What will happen if we don't confront false teaching? What are some of the effects of a false teaching circulating in a church?*

- 3 **What is the connection between confrontation and reconciliation?** (See Titus 1:13, 2 Timothy 2:24-25)

🗨️ *Have you known a person who could both confront and lead toward reconciliation? What does that look like? Think of the words, actions, steps, and measures that should be used in both sides.*

🗨️ *How do you prefer to be corrected? How should we correct others who have been led astray?*

❤️ *Look at Titus 1:13-14. What was the ultimate purpose for Titus's refuting and silencing the false teachers? How should this affect our goals and strategy when we confront others?*
