**DEUTERONOMY 33** 

Each week, we will highlight one of GGC's culture code in connection with the 10:30am Gospel Growth study. Read the description of Commitment to Holiness and discuss what stands out in it to you. God's design for the church is that we would be a "called-out" people. By grace, we have been delivered from a lifestyle of sin and taught to live in holiness. Therefore, we are committed to personal and corporate purity through accountability, discipline and separation from sin and false teaching.
