## 1 TIMOTHY 5:1-15, 6:1-2

1 Paul wrote 1 Timothy so that we would know how to live as members of the household of God. What are some of the implications of being in a familial relationship with other Christians in a church?

🧱 Read 1 Tim. 5:1-2. How do those implications apply to offering correction to someone? Think of ways that are clear, but also affirm the other person as a member of God's family?

🤹 How can young singles practically uphold Paul's admonition to treat one another as siblings with all purity?

What does this passage's instruction about caring for widows reveal about the heart and character of God? What do you know about widows during that time?

🎔 What does this tell us about His priorities and attributes? See Psalm 68:5, Deuteronomy 10:17-18, James 1:27.

3 Do you know any widows in the church? How can we assure they are being properly cared for?

In a culture and economic system where disability and life insurance are available, along with 401(k)s, nursing homes and assisted living centers, what responsibility should the church have towards widows?

♀ How could the principles of 1 Timothy 5 still relate to the church today when all these safety nets are in place?

- I Timothy 5, Paul provides very practical instruction to bring clarity to what can sometimes be a complex topic--how should the church care for those in need. For those who have needs, what is the balance between asking for help from the church but not becoming an unnecessary drain on the church's resources?
